HEALTH TIPS MERS-CoV

MERS CoV, or Middle East Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus, is a viral illness primarily manifesting acute respiratory symptoms. It is not known yet for certain where the virus came from, but some studies have associated it with camels and bats, which may have been passed directly to humans. This virus, first reported in Saudi Arabia in 2012, is considered a deadlier but less-transmissible cousin of the SARS virus which erupted in Asia in 2003.

Symptoms include fever, colds, cough, difficulty of breathing, and in some cases, diarrhea. It may also complicate to pneumonia, and kidney and respiratory failure in advanced cases.

If you recently traveled to countries in the Arabian Peninsula or neighboring countries and developed these symptoms within 14 days, you should see your healthcare provider and mention your recent travel. The Department of Foreign Affairs does not recommend that anyone change their travel plans because of MERS CoV, more so prevent Overseas Filipino Workers from returning to the Philippines.

AIDS

ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME

AIDS is one of the deadly diseases in human history. The World Health Organization (WHO) in 2011 has determined the global prevalence to 0.8% with most cases concentrated in Africa (one in 20 adults). Data from WHO showed that of the 95 million people from 119 countries tested in 2010, 34M people came out positive and are living with HIV/AIDS. About 69% of HIV positives came from the Sub Saharan African Region. There are 1.7M deaths worldwide.

More than 20 years ago (1982), doctors in the United States identified the first cases of AIDS in New York and San Francisco. Since then, more than 70 million people have been infected and 35 million have died. In the US alone, one person becomes infected every 9 minutes.

AIDS is caused by the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). HIV destroys the CD4 helper lymphocyte, a type of defense cell in the body. These lymphocytes are part of the body's immune system, the defense system that fights infectious diseases. As HIV destroys these lymphocytes, a person with the virus begins to get serious infections — that is, they become immune deficient. Thus the name for this condition is acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS).

As the medical researchers learn more about how HIV works, they've been able to develop drugs, antiviral medications to inhibit it. These drugs have been successful in slowing the progress of the disease. People with the disease now live much longer. But there is still NO CURE for HIV and AIDS. People who have AIDS tend to keep getting sicker, especially if they are not taking antiviral medications properly. HIV is transmitted from an infected person to another person through blood, semen, vaginal fluids, and breast milk, unprotected oral, vaginal, or anal sexual intercourse, sharing needles, such as needles used to inject drugs (including needles used for injecting steroids and those used for tattooing). Because of blood testing, it's now extremely rare for someone in developed countries to get HIV through a blood transfusion.



People who have other sexually transmitted diseases such as syphilis, genital herpes, chlamydia, gonorrhea are at greater risk for getting HIV during sex with infected partners. A newborn baby can catch the virus from her HIV positive mother before birth, during the birthing process, or from breastfeeding.

Once a person's blood lacks the number of CD4 / helper T cells required to fight infections, or the person has signs of specific illnesses or diseases that occur in people with HIV infection, doctors make a diagnosis of AIDS. Severe symptoms of HIV infection and AIDS may not appear for 10 years. The amount of time it takes for symptoms of AIDS to appear varies from person to person.

Some people may feel and look healthy for years while they are infected with HIV. It is still possible to infect others with HIV, even if the person with the virus has absolutely no symptoms. You cannot tell simply by looking at someone whether he or she is infected.

Instead, it advises travelers from or transiting in high-risk areas, particularly those who have been in close contact with somebody suspected to be infected with MERS CoV, to follow standard precautionary measures

They should also practice self-quarantine if warranted, be aware of the symptoms, maintain proper hygiene and adopt other preventive measures.

These include:

- 1. Frequent proper hand washing with soap and water for 20 seconds. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based sanitizer.
- 2. Cover your nose and mouth with tissue when sneezing and coughing because it is transmitted thru droplets; properly dispose tissues immediately.
- 3. The virus is also often spread when somebody touches something that is contaminated with germs and touches his eyes, nose or mouth. So avoid touching them especially with unwashed hands. Regularly clean frequently touched surfaces (door knobs, toys, handles), too.
- 4. It is contagious thru close contact. Avoid close interaction, such as kissing, sharing cups, or sharing eating utensils, with sick people.
- 5. It is aggravated if you are immunocompromised. Strengthen your immune system by sleeping 8 hours a day, hydrating well with at least 8 glasses of water a day (more if you are under the sun or depending on your health status or how active you are), and adopting healthy eating habits.

Experts are still struggling to understand MERS CoV, for which there is no known vaccine. There are no specific treatments recommended, but it is advised that people follow these tips to help prevent the illnesses.

If you don't have a VCAM account, click the "Request for VCAM account" and Fill-out the "Request Form" then click Submit.

You will receive an email from VCAM informing you that you have emailed a request for VCAM account and the system will verify the account that you registered. Wait for 24-48 hours for the processing of your account.

Once the system verified your account, you will receive an email for your default password. If the account that you registered has a problem, VCAM will send you an email and will ask to register again or call ValuCare customer care 7023310.


